

RESTAURANT GUIDE – KING OF PRUSSIA

Friends –

Here's a partial list of local restaurants with some notes from me. Remember, guests of the Alloy have a free shuttle service to any location within 5 miles of the hotel. The driver will certainly know all destinations and may have some favorite spots of their own!

Some suggestions:

The King of Prussia Town Center is about 2 miles away and is home to a dozen or so varied restaurants. Most have outdoor dining options and you can stroll after dinner! (It's also the home of the great Wegman's Supermarket.) Here are some of those spots:

Paladar – Latin American food and drinks and one of my go-to places with a great happy hour.

Founding Farmers – Varied menu, lots of locally sourced foods, pretty good spot.

City Works – Sports bar, pub and brewery

Davio's Northern Italian Steakhouse

Fogo de Chao Brazilian Steakhouse

The King of Prussia Mall is one of the 2 largest in the USA. There are restaurants inside and along the perimeter and there's plenty to see and shop. There are 2 food courts as well.

Along the perimeter and exterior you'll find:

Bahama Breeze (Caribbean style)

California Pizza Kitchen (great GF pizza!)

Morton's Steakhouse (\$\$\$\$)

Capital Grille (\$\$\$\$)

True Foods (wholesome and comfort food)

Maggiano's (Southern Italian)

Seasons 52 – a favorite or mine

Cheesecake Factory

Legal Seafood (\$\$)

Sullivan's Steakhouse (\$\$\$\$)

Eddie V's (upscale seafood \$\$\$\$)

Gaucha's Prime (supposed to open in June, \$64 Brazilian steakhouse)

Chili's

The Melting Pot (Fondue, \$\$\$)

Bartaco, North Italia and Morgan's Brooklyn Barbeque (alongside the Mall between Macy's and Nordstrom's and with indoor and outdoor dining)

And more...

There are many more in the area – just ask the hotel staff, local players or me for recommendations. I frequent Plaza Azteca (large portions of Mexican food and big margaritas), Seasons 52 (a true favorite) and Peppers (just 2 blocks away and good Italian food, pizza and drink) and the King of Prussia Tavern and Grill (also 2 blocks away with poker and pool some evenings.) There's a legit Starbucks also just past Wild Rice (Asian fusion and sushi) across from Wawa (a convenience store and gas station with lots of grocery items and take-away foods.) Giant Supermarket is ½ mile away. Remember, the Alloy has dinner service at the bar or the tables surrounding it and room service as well. And if you want a great Philly hoagie or steak sandwich or a local-favorite pizza head to Franzone's just about 2 miles away – or they deliver! 610-275-0114

For fast(er) food, Burger King, McD's, Wendy's, Panera and Chipotle are very close by.

KING OF PRUSSIA TO-DO

King of Prussia is a town in Upper Merion Township / Montgomery County and about 25 minutes from Philadelphia. We are just a couple of miles from one of the most important and revered sites from the War of Independence, Valley Forge National Park. If you can do no more than drive through, it's worth it! There are also guided trolley tours, 30 miles of hiking trails and more. Hotel guests might take advantage of the shuttle service – inquire at the desk.

KOP has a Regal UA IMAX theater, indoor skydiving at iFLY, and a brand new TopGolf facility with driving range, sports bar and restaurant.

The King of Prussia Mall is a shopper's dream with hundreds of stores including a luxury mile worth walking by. There are 2 food courts and many restaurants – all less than a mile away.
