#### WE ARE A "ZERO TOLERANCE" REGIONAL

**ZERO TOLERANCE:** The ACBL Zero Tolerance (ZT) Policy will be in effect throughout the tournament. All players and participants are expected to behave in accordance with this policy at all times towards their partners, opponents, directors, caddies, tournament officials, and hotel staff. A director should be called immediately to handle any breaches of ZT, the rules, or code of ethics.

Examples of unacceptable behaviors include: badgering, rudeness, intimidation, profanity, threats, or violence; negative comments about the opponents' bidding or play; gloating; constant, unwelcome, or gratuitous lessons or analysis; disruptive arguments with the directors; and ringing cell phones.

**ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT POLICY:** Any electronic equipment must be kept in silent mode (except for health-related equipment, where silent mode is unavailable or could constitute a health risk). While at the table, players may not use or interact with their electronic devices during bridge play. When between rounds or sitting out, use or interaction with electronic devices is permitted, provided it is inaudible. These rules apply to all players, captains, coaches and kibitzers.

**BE SENSITIVE ABOUT SCENTS!** Smoking is prohibited everywhere inside the hotel and event facility. Any smoking must be done at least 25 feet from any building entrance. Penalties will be assessed by the Director for lateness to any player who delays the start of a round or match due to a "smoke break."

Please refrain from wearing cologne, after shave lotion, perfume, perfumed hand lotion, fragranced hair products, and/or similar products. Fragrances can cause serious health issues for some people.
