

THINGS TO SEE IN SOUTH JERSEY

Adventure Aquarium



Located 23 minutes west along the Delaware River, it features over 15,000 aquatic animals, with the largest shark collection in the Northeast and the world's only hippos exhibited in an aquarium.

Red Bank Battlefield Park



Located 22 minutes southwest along the Delaware River, this was the location of the Battle of Red Bank in the American Revolutionary War on October 22, 1777.

Edelman Planetarium



Located 30 minutes south on the campus of Rowan University, this planetarium features laser shows and educational exhibits.

Grounds for Sculpture



Located 34 minutes north in Hamilton Township, NJ, you can find this 42-acre oversized sculpture park and museum.

THINGS TO SEE IN SOUTH JERSEY

USS New Jersey Battleship



Located 22 minutes west along the Delaware River, the Battleship New Jersey Museum & Memorial is open daily for tours.

Edelman Fossil Park & Museum



Located 24 minutes south near Rowan University, the museum features full-scale dinosaur sculptures, an interactive fossil scavenger hunt, free-roaming virtual reality, and live animal exhibits.

D.R.E.A.M. Park



Located 30 minutes southwest, the Gloucester County DREAM Park serves as a beautiful, functional space for equine activities, community engagement, and therapeutic support.

Atlantic City Casinos



Located 1 hour southeast, play slots, poker, and table games at premier destinations like the Borgata and Caesars.

Wheaton Arts & Cultural Center



Located 48 minutes south, this 65-acre arts center in a wooded setting hosts a glass museum, artist's studios, and a picnic grove.

THINGS TO SEE IN THE PHILADELPHIA AREA

**Philadelphia
Museum of Art**



Located 28 minutes away in Philly, the museum is famous for its vast, encyclopedic collections spanning world cultures, iconic "Rocky Steps," and holdings of American art (Eakins), European masters (Cézanne, Monet), and modern art (Duchamp, Brancusi).

**Independence
Hall**



Located 25 minutes away in Philly, this Georgian hall is where the Declaration of Independence and the U.S. Constitution were debated and signed.

Liberty Bell



Located 24 minutes away in Philly, the Liberty Bell, previously called the State House Bell or Old State House Bell, is an iconic symbol of American independence.

**JFK Plaza
(Love Park)**



Located 26 minutes away in Philly, the John F. Kennedy Plaza is the home of Robert Indiana's iconic (and highly Instagrammable!) LOVE statue since 1976.

**Reading
Terminal Market**



Located 25 minutes away in Philly, this famous indoor market offers diverse fare, housewares, and area specialties since 1893.

THINGS TO SEE IN THE PHILADELPHIA AREA

Magic Gardens



Located 30 minutes away in Philly, the Magic Gardens is a folk-art environment that spans three city lots, and includes indoor galleries and a large outdoor labyrinth.

Philadelphia Zoo



Located 32 minutes away in Philly, the zoo is praised as America's first zoo with unique features like its 360 Trail for close-up animal viewing, interactive kids' areas, and strong conservation efforts.

Longwood Gardens



Located 1 hour west in Kennett Square, PA, this is a destination that consists of more than 1,100 acres of gardens, woodlands, and meadows with dazzling displays that elevate the art of horticulture.

Barnes Foundation



Located 28 minutes away in Philly, explore the Barnes Foundation's renowned collection of impressionist, post-Impressionist, and modern art.

The Franklin Institute



Located 26 minutes away in Philly, admission here includes access to three floors of hands-on science exhibits and experiences.

Philadelphia Sports Complex



Located 21 minutes away in Philly, you can find the Phillies, Flyers, Sixers, and Eagles facilities all in one small area.

Eastern State Penitentiary



Located 28 minutes away in Philly, this is a historic, castle-like haunted former prison famous for pioneering solitary confinement for reform, hosting notorious inmates like Al Capone, now a museum offering tours.

Kimmel Center for the Performing Arts



Located 30 minutes away in Philly, this is a dazzling performing arts center whose discreet brick exterior rises to a bold 150-foot glass vaulted rooftop for startling views of the city.

Museum of the American Revolution



Located 28 minutes away in Philly, this museum explores the dramatic, surprising story of the American Revolution and its enduring legacy.

Cheesesteaks
